I. GENERAL

1. The Headquarters, 42d Field Artillery Brigade was inspected during the period of 14-18 December 1981. The inspection was conducted by Major Joe L. Smith, members of the V Corps Inspector General Office, and inspectors from the V Corps staff. The inspection included the brigade headquarters, the headquarters battery and 202d MP Company.

2. The findings developed during the inspection will be reviewed by and coordinated with the V Corps Headquarters Staff. Findings contained herein are considered final although some modifications may result from V Corps staffing. Changes may be issued later under separate cover. Areas within this report rated as satisfactory will not be downgraded as a result of staff review. Areas rated as unsatisfactory may be upgraded.

II. OVERVIEW. An outline of those areas noted during the inspection that were performing well or those that require additional emphasis is noted in the following paragraphs. Detailed comments on each area are shown in the inclosures. Additionally, training, assistance, and helpful information was provided to many of the unit's guides during the course of the inspection.

8. Climate of the Command. Appearance of the soldiers throughout the 42d Field Artillery Brigade during this series of inspections, was considered good throughout the brigade. The only exception to this were some instances of unsatisfactory haircuts in the units in the Giessen area. The morale and attitude of the soldiers within the brigade seemed positive with a few isolated exceptions. These cases appear to have been caused by a failure of the NCO's to listen to the concerns of their soldiers and look after their needs. There appeared to be an absence of open communication and sensing sessions to keep leaders attuned to their soldiers' problems, although concern for the welfare of the soldiers assigned to the unit was particularly good in the 1/333 Field Artillery at Wiesbaden.

9. Summary. The brigade headquarters achieved a satisfactory rating in all but one of the major functional areas of the inspection: Brigade Food Service Program which was rated unsatisfactory because of a lack of attention and command emphasis in the past. A detailed report of the Brigade Food Service Program was provided at the exit brief on 16 December 1981. HQ Battery was rated unsatisfactory in several areas of the inspection: Unit Administration, Alcohol Drug Abuse Prevention Control Program, Individual Training, Supply Activities, and Maintenance Operations. The 202d MP Company was rated as unsatisfactory in Small Arms Maintenance and Maintenance Operations. The Department

of the Army Special Subjects for Inspection noted as requiring additional emphasis were the Physical Training Program, Supply and Maintenance Operations in HQ Btry, and Maintenance Operations in the 202d MP Company. Maintenance of NBC Protective Masks were also rated unsatisfactory in both of the units at Brigade Headquarters. The V Corps Items of Special Interest (ISI) requiring additional emphasis are Security of Arms and Ammunition in HQ Btry and Management of PLL in both HQ Btry and 202d MP. Small Arms Maintenance was noted as a problem area in the 202d MP Company.

12. Review and Correction.
