## ANNUAL UNIT HISTORY FOR THE 528TH USAAG 1984

## I. INTRODUCTION //A

The 528th United States Army Artillery Group was organized in the United States Army on 4 January 1944 as the 528th Field Artillery Battalion. The 528th was activated on 21 January 1944 at Camp Hood, Texas and remained on active duty less than three years. During this period, the 528th Field Artillery Battalion served in the European Theater of operations and was awarded World War II Rineland and Central Europe compaign streamers. On 1 November 1946, the unit was inactivated at Camp Hood, Texas. The unit was then allotted to the organized reserves and activated on 7 July 1947 at Chicago Illinois as the 934th Field Artillery Battalion. The unit was withdrawn from the reserves and allotted to the regular army on 13 December 1952. From 18 March 1955 to 10 June 1956, the unit was activated and served in South Korea. The unit was redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment 528th United States Artillery Group and activated on 1 April 1959, at Fort Sill, Oklahoma under the Command of Colonel Lindsay J. DeFrees. The unit was assigned to the United States Army Europe in May of 1959, and completed its move to Corlu, Turkey on 12 July 1959. For identification purposes within Turkey, the unit was designated "TUSLOG DETACHMENT 67". In March 1963, the 528th moved from Corlu, Turkey to its present station at Cakamkli, Turkey; approximately thirty-three kilometers Northwest of Istanbul. In the fall of 1982, the unit was no longer required to refer to its TUSLOG designation and was publicly acknowledged as the 528th United States Army Artillery Group. On 8 December 1983, the current Commander COL Richard A. Manupella assumed command from COL Robert D. Chelbourg.

#### II. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION

A. The 528th United States Army Artillery Group consists of six subordinate units. They are the 70th Ordnance Company, Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 10th, 14th, 21st, and the 27th USAFADS. HHD and the 70th Ords CO are Headquarterd together at Cakmakli, Turkey. The 10th USAFAD is located near the village of Ortakoy, Turkey approximately 40 miles Northwest of Celibolu in Thrace. The 14th USAFAD is located near the village of Kosekoy, Turkey, which is near the city of 12mit in Asia. The 21st USAFAD also in Thrace, is located just outside the city of Corlu. The 27th USAFAD, by far the most remote detachment, is located in Eastern Anatolia near the Soviet border and is approximately 1200 miles from Headquarters at Cakmakli.
